## Tournament Report for Third TCC CYCC Qualifier April 28th, 2024



The Toronto Chess Centre recently hosted its third junior tournament, serving as qualifier for the Canadian Championship Youth Chess (CYCC). With a solid turnout of players, 100 the event highlighted the growing interest and enthusiasm for chess among young competitors.

Participants competed across multiple age categories, including the Under 8 (U8), Under 10 (U10), and Under 12 (U12) sections. Additionally, the Under 14, Under 16, and Under 18 sections were merged, providing a platform for all players to demonstrate their skills and vie for qualification to the national championship.

Consistent with previous tournaments, the time control remained set at 20 minutes per player with an additional 5 seconds increment per move. This format ensured fast-paced and exciting gameplay, keeping participants engaged and challenged throughout the event.

In recognition of outstanding performance, medals were awarded to the top three boys in each section and the top-performing girl in each category. This inclusive approach aimed to celebrate both individual achievement and gender diversity within the chess community.

In the Under 8 (U8) section, Sanul Divadalage and Rishav Pai both secured impressive scores of 4.5 out of 5 points. Their exceptional performances included victories against strong opponents, with their only draw occurring in their head-to-head encounter. As a result, both Sanul Divadalage and Rishav Pai were awarded the gold medal for their outstanding achievements in the U8 category.



Following closely behind, **Allen Jiang** demonstrated skill and determination, securing a score of 4 out of 5 points. His performance earned him the bronze medal in the fiercely contested U8 section.

In the U8 girls' category, Isabella Liu showcased her talent, achieving a notable score of 3.5 out of 5 points. Isabella's dedication to the game earned her the gold medal, distinguishing her as the top-performing girl in her section.

In the Under 10 (U10) section, Isaac Tam demonstrated determination, securina flawless victory with a perfect score of 5 out of 5 points. Isaac's focus propelled him to the top of the standings, earning him the gold medal. Lucas Lao delivered a stellar performance, securing impressive score of 4 out of 5 points, earning a silver medal.



In the U10 girls' category, Arianna Yuan and Sanya Divadalge showcased exceptional talent and resilience, each earning a well-deserved gold medal for their outstanding performances. Their dedication to the game and strategic acumen set them apart as formidable competitors in their division.

In the Under 12 (U12) section, Sayan Ganeshanathan exceptional skill demonstrated securing a flawless victory with a perfect score of 5 out of 5 points. Following closely behind, Kyle Sit delivered an impressive performance, securing a score of 4 out of 5 points. Kyle's gameplay silver medal. earned him the his showcasing talent and determination in the U12 section.



In the U12 girls' category, Flora Zhang exhibited remarkable skill and resilience, achieving a notable score of 4 out of 5 points. Flora's strategic prowess and dedication to the game earned her the gold medal, distinguishing her as the top-performing girl in her division.

The U14, U16 and U18 sections were merged and there were no females in those sections.

In the U14 category, Ivan Povoliashko got gold with 4/5. Adhvaith Ajay, Ziyang Liu and Sichang Huang all got silver with a fantastic score of 3.5/5



In the U16 section, Boaxuan swept the field with his phenomenal play and got gold with 5/5. Lastly, in the U18 section, Eitan Hulli demonstrated his resilience to earn himself a gold with a score of 3/5.
