The Toronto Chess Centre hosted its second Double Qualifier Tournament March 17th, 2024, at the Elgin Barrow Arena. Building upon the success of the inaugural event, this tournament proved to be a smoother and even more engaging experience for all involved. The tournament featured five sections, with genders merged: U8, U10, U12, U14, U16 & 18.

A total of 117 participants eagerly took part in the tournament, each competing in five games under a time control of 20 minutes with an additional 5 seconds per move. To ensure the comfort and well-being of the players, snacks and water were provided throughout the event.

One of the highlights of the tournament was the recognition awarded to outstanding players. The top performers in each section received well-deserved medals, alongside the top female player in each category. Additionally, all attendees of the closing ceremony were presented with a small gift of their choice, accompanied by a certificate commemorating their participation.

In the U8 section, young talents showcased their skills with remarkable enthusiasm. Jingchen Wu emerged as the standout player, achieving a flawless record of 5 out of 5 games and securing the coveted gold medal. However, the competition was fierce for the remaining podium positions, with three participants tying for second place.



Rishav Pai and **Nathan Wang** demonstrated exceptional prowess, each earning a silver medal with a commendable score of 4 out of 5 games. Notably, **Victoria Strugach**, a remarkable 6-year-old talent, showcased her remarkable abilities by also achieving a score of 4 out of 5 games, earning her the gold medal as the top girl in the U8 category.

The U10 section witnessed fierce competition and impressive displays of talent from the young contenders. Jacob (Zicheng) Li emerged as the undisputed champion, showcasing impeccable skill and determination with a flawless score of 5 out of 5 games, earning him the prestigious gold medal.



However, the battle for the remaining podium positions was intense, resulting in a three-way tie for second place. **Zander Yu** and **William Han-Wang** demonstrated exceptional performance, each securing a silver medal with a score of 4 out of 5 games. **Sanya Divadalage** showcased her skills by also achieving a score of 4 out of 5 games, earning her the gold medal as the top girl in the U10 section.

The **U12 section** witnessed intense battles and remarkable skill displays of from its Siddharth participants. Surendran, the top-rated player, showcased his dominance with a dominating performance, securing the gold medal with a perfect score of 5 out of 5 games.



James (Junze) Li and Kingsly Wong distinguished themselves, both earning silver medals with impressive scores of 4 out of 5 games. Furthermore, the competition among the girls in the U12 category was equally fierce. Chloe Zeng and Nikita Kamath each secured a score of 3 out of 5 games and they earned gold medals as the top girls in the U12 section.

In the U14 section, Aiden Li emerged as the standout player, achieving a perfect score of 5 out of 5 games, securing the gold medal.

In a tightly contested battle for the remaining podium positions, four players distinguished themselves, resulting in a fourway tie for second place.



Eric Xie, Matthew Smolkov, Sicheng Huang, and Khurana Vihaan Bhanot each earned silver medals with strong scores of 4 out of 5 games. Additionally, Ashley Chow delivered a commendable performance in the U14 category, earning a gold medal as the top girl with a score of 3 out of 5 games.

In the merger of the U16 and U18 sections, all the games were competitive. Leo Tan and Yifan emerged Wang as champions, each securing a gold medal with scores of 4 out of 5 battle for The the games. remaining podium positions was equally intense, with Joey Lin and delivering Aarya Patil strong performances to secure bronze medals, each with a score of 3.5 out of 5 games.
