## February CYCC, OCC and Master Camp Qualifier



### **ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT**

Held on February 2, 2025, at St. Roberts Catholic High School, TCC's February CYCC, OCC and Master Camp Qualifier attracted 85 participants across five sections: U8, U10, U12, U14, and U16 & 18. The familiar venue once again proved to be an ideal setting, accommodating players and spectators alike.

The return of the OCC qualifier added an extra layer of excitement to this edition of the tournament. Hosting its first-ever triple qualifier, the event provided young players with multiple pathways to showcase their skills. Not only was it an OCC and CYCC qualifier, but it also offered participants the chance to earn a spot in an exclusive one-day Master Camp for distinguished players!



#### **MASTER CAMP**

This is a full-day CYCC preparation camp, exclusively for the top players in TCC's February, March and April youth chess tournaments.

Enrollment is free of charge and by qualification only, for the top 10% of each section in TCC's tournaments.

Their collective contributions helped make this qualifier not only a success but a memorable experience for all involved.

#### **SECTION WINNERS**

In the U8 section, the competition was fierce, with Rishant Mishra and Wilson Lu emerging as co-champions, both scoring an impressive 4/5 to secure gold medals. William Xia and Asher Zhang finished with 3/5, earning bronze medals for their strong performances. Olivia Zhang distinguished herself as the top girl in the section, earning a gold medal with a score of 2.5/5. Additionally, Rishant Mishra and Wilson Lu secured their spots in the exclusive one-day training camp, further rewarding their outstanding performances.



The U10 section saw an incredibly competitive field, culminating in a four-way tie for first place. Michael Jivin, Theo Chan, Tansh Tatke, and Valerie Kit Lin Ho all delivered strong performances, finishing with 4/5 to claim gold medals. Valerie Kit Lin Ho also earned the distinction of being the top girl in the section. As a reward for their outstanding play, all four players secured their spots in the upcoming one-day training camp on June 1, 2025.



In the U12 section, Arianna Yuan delivered a stellar performance, scoring 4.5/5 to claim both the gold medal and the Top Girl award. Adam Mei also finished with 4.5/5, securing a gold medal. Felix Lin put in a strong effort to finish with 4/5, earning the bronze medal. Adam Mei and Arianna Yuan qualified for the 1-day camp.



The U14 section was dominated by Aiden Li, who delivered a flawless performance with a perfect 5/5 score to claim the gold medal. Kingsly Wong followed closely behind, securing silver with an impressive 4/5. Lu Lu Wai Yan and Arnav Medavarapu both finished with 3.5/5 to share third place. Flora Zhang earned the Top Girl award with a score of 2.5/5. As the champion of the section, Aiden Li also secured his spot in the one-day training camp.



In the combined U16-U18 section, Narek Hovhannisyan dominated the field with a perfect 5/5 score, securing the gold medal and earning his spot in the one-day training camp. Andy Wang followed closely behind, delivering a strong performance with 4/5 to take silver. Amuthan Haricharan claimed bronze with a solid 3/5. Alexa Roque finished with 3/5 to earn both the Top Girl title and a gold medal. Meanwhile, Kai-En Huang was recognized as the top U18 player, securing gold in that category with a score of 2.5/5.
