The Toronto Chess Centre hosted its final double qualifier of the season on April 13, 2025, at St. Robert Catholic High School. This event served as a pathway to both the Ontario Chess Challenge and the Canadian Youth Chess Championship. A total of 130 players participated across four sections: U8, U10, U12, and a combined U14–U16–U18 group, showcasing strong competition and enthusiasm from young chess talents.

The tournament also marked the last chance for players to qualify for the exclusive one-day Master Camp, open to the top 10% of each section. With high stakes and a competitive atmosphere, the event wrapped up the season on a high note, highlighting the dedication and growth of Ontario's youth chess.

In the U10 section, Tansh Tatke took gold with a perfect 5/5 score. There was a four-way tie for second, with Rishav Pai, Theo Chan, Brian Tang, and Sirui Liu all earning silver with 4/5. Sanya Divadalage scored 4/5 and was awarded gold as the top girl in the U10 section.
