ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT

On June 7–8, 2025, the Toronto Chess Centre hosted its final tournament of the season. It was an open event that welcomed both juniors and adults to compete. Unlike previous tournaments in 2025, which had been exclusively for junior players, this event broadened participation and drew a turnout of 82 players. Held at St. Robert Catholic High School, the tournament featured five sections: Crown, U2100, U1800, U1500, and a special U1200 section designated for juniors. The time control was a classical 60 minutes plus a 30-second increment. Trophies were awarded to the winners of each section, while silver and bronze medalists received medals to recognize their strong performances.

The success of the event would not have been possible without the dedicated efforts of high school students that helped us tremendously in this event. SECTION WINNERS

In the U1200 Juniors section, **Puranjay Tripathy** delivered a strong performance to take clear first place with an impressive score of 4.5/5. The battle for second was closely contested, resulting in a three-way tie at 3.5/5. After applying tiebreaks, **Jacob Kagan** was awarded the silver medal, while **Marcus Xie** and **Sirui Liu** shared the bronze.

The U1500 section saw a dominant performance from **Luke Noftall**, who clinched first place with a perfect 5/5 score. Second place was a tight race, with **Brent Goff** and **Tansh Tatkeboth** finishing with 4/5. Tiebreaks ultimately favored Brent Goff for the silver medal, while Tansh Tatke earned the bronze.

The U1800 section featured a tightly contested race at the top, with **Spencer Cetinicemerging** as the champion after edging out his closest competitor on tiebreaks. Both Spencer and **Bernard Chiu** finished with 4/5, but it was Spencer who claimed the trophy, while Bernard took home the silver medal. Two players ended the event with 3.5/5, and it was **Jose Luis Castillo Simon** who secured the bronze on superior tiebreaks.

In the U2100 section, **Jayden Zihan Zhan** claimed the trophy with a strong 4/5 finish, prevailing on tiebreaks in a competitive field. **Riyaan Lakhani** also scored 4/5 and was awarded the silver medal. Just behind the leaders, **Isaac Duanmu** secured the bronze with a solid 3.5/5.

In the Open Section, **Nolan Wu** captured the trophy with a strong performance, finishing at the top of the standings with 4/5. **Saarthak Malakar** and **Anthony Maulucci** both scored 3.5/5, and based on tiebreaks, Saarthak was awarded the silver medal while Anthony took home the bronze.
