About the tournament

The Toronto Chess Centre (TCC) kicked off its **first tournament of the season** on September 21, 2025, hosting a combined Ontario Chess Challenge (OCC) and Canadian Youth Chess Championship (CYCC) Double Qualifier.

The event featured five competitive sections. They were U8, U10, U12, U14, and a combined U16 and U18 section. **A total of 144** participants from across the region. St. Roberts Catholic High School served as the venue, conveniently located near the Highway 407 and Highway 404 interchange.

Saluting Our Standout Competitors

On the following pages, we are proud to highlight the outstanding achievements of the players in each section, honoring the winners who rose to the top through dedication and remarkable play.



U8 section

The U8 section had 20 young players. Harshil Swain achieved a perfect 5/5 score to secure the gold medal. Close behind, Shreyas Paralikar, Max Yun, and Rishant Mishra each scored 4/5, earning silver medals for their efforts. On the girls' side, Anaisha Sharma and Rowena Gao distinguished themselves with strong results of 3/5, both earning gold.



U10 section

The U10 section drew 25 participants. Leading the field was Rishav Pai, who claimed the gold medal with a perfect 5/5 score. Just behind him, Tansh Tatke, Aadhi Alagappan, Matthew Koo, and Jake Xu each finished with 4/5, earning well-deserved silver medals. Saoirse Zhang and Chelsea Daley both got 3/5, securing gold as the top U10 girls.



U12 section

The U12 section was the largest with 49 players. Rising to the top was **Diyor Muminov**, who captured gold with a perfect 5/5 score. **Nilaanujan Gowrishankar** and **Gregory Romanov** each scored 4.5/5, earning silver medals. In the girls' category, **Elena Sharafi Masouleh** delivered a strong 4/5 performance, securing gold as top U12 girl.



U14 section

The U14 section brought together 34 players. Leading the way was Sayan Ganeshanathan, who secured gold with a 4.5/5 finish. Just half a point behind, Konner Virgo Coquilla, Kingsly Wong, and Adam Mei each scored 4/5 to claim silver medals. Aaradhana Ganesh Kumar and Flora Zhang both earned gold as the top girls with 2.5/5.





U16 and U18 sections

The U16 and U18 sections were combined into a single group of 16 players. In the U18 category, **Ruslan Kotapuri** emerged on top, securing gold as the leading U18 boy with a score of 4/5. In the U16 category, **Aiden Li** and **Peter Lomov** tied for first, each earning gold as the top boys with 4/5, while **Jaden He** followed closely with 3.5/5 to claim bronze. **Ayla Maslov** finished with 3.5/5 to capture gold as the top U16 girl.

Exciting News

The Toronto Chess Centre's **next event** is scheduled for **Saturday**, **October 18**, **2025**, once again at St. Robert Catholic High School. Like this month's tournament, it will serve as a Double Qualifier for both the Ontario Chess Challenge and the Canadian Youth Chess Championship.

In addition to the qualifier, the Toronto Chess Centre will be launching a **brand-new initiative** on October 18, 2025: its first-ever **TCC Grand Prix**. This exclusive event will be reserved **for players rated above 1700 CFC**, providing a higher-level competitive arena for advanced juniors. The winner of the Grand Prix events will earn the right to represent TCC at **an all expenses covered trip to the famous International Kavala Open in Greece!**
